The Texas Shakespeare Festival Guild Board is busy making plans and preparing for the 2022 season. This year's shows will be the 37th season of performances for the festival. The lineup includes these plays to anticipate: The Taming of the Shrew by William Shakespeare, a romantic comedy; Nell Gwynn by Jessica Swale, based on the true life story of Nell Gwynn; The Tempest by William Shakespeare, a story of love and redemption; The Music Man by Meredith Willson, a show that is perfect

for the entire family; and *The* Hog Princess by DJ Canaday, an original fractured fairytale adventure for the whole family.

Ticket sales begin at midnight, Sunday, May 2nd, for current Guild members. Sales to the general public will begin at midnight, Sunday, May 9th.
